Washington Gas Project: Prince George's County and District of Columbia Reliability and Reinforcement Project ROUTE 301 (CRAIN HWY) BETWEEN FRANK TIPPETT ROAD AND TRUMPS HILL ROAD

Dear Neighbor,

At Washington Gas, we work each and every day to safely and reliably meet the energy needs of our customers. Today, clean-burning natural gas is the fuel of choice for more than nine out of ten new homebuyers in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, and Washington Gas serves more than 1.1 million customers through the region. As our region continues to grow, expansion and rehabilitation of our existing infrastructure is critical to maintaining our natural gas distribution system.

As part of the Prince George's County and District of Columbia Reliability and Reinforcement Project (PGDCRRP), Washington Gas is constructing new infrastructure to serve Prince George's County and our entire service territory. This very important project is just one of many infrastructure improvements underway.

Active Construction

Construction for this project started in October 2018, near the corner of Frank Tippett Road and Route 301 (Crain Highway). Construction is continuing north along Route 301, approximately 2.5 miles, toward the corner of Trumps Hill Road. For this permitted section of the project, work will occur 7 days a week from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and is expected to be completed by October 2019. Construction schedules may be affected by weather and other unforeseen circumstances.

How This Might Affect Your Commute

One northbound lane will be closed with concrete barriers in the area of active construction. Please follow traffic control signs for lane closure and reduced speed limit information. Traffic controls are managed by a traffic control plan approved by The Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration.

Restoration Plans

Temporary road restoration will be made immediately following the completion of this construction project. Permanent restoration will be made in compliance with the permit and occur within 45 days after all work is completed, weather permitting. Washington Gas will restore the roads and affected areas to an as-found condition.

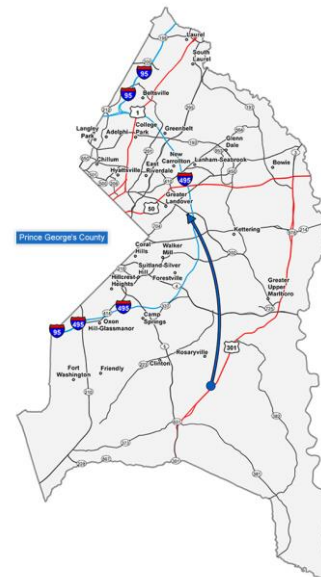

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About the PGDCRRP Project

Washington Gas is constructing new infrastructure to serve Prince George's County and our entire service territory.



Built mostly in public and electric utility corridors, the project paves the way for economic growth and serving more residents with clean, affordable natural gas service. The investment will include approximately 16 miles of coated steel, natural gas pipeline and regulating stations connecting two portions of Washington Gas' existing system.

The project begins near the corner of Frank Tippett Road and Route 301 and continues north to a location on Brightseat Road near the corner of Route 202 in Landover, Maryland.

The entire project is expected to be completed prior to the 2020/2021 winter season.
