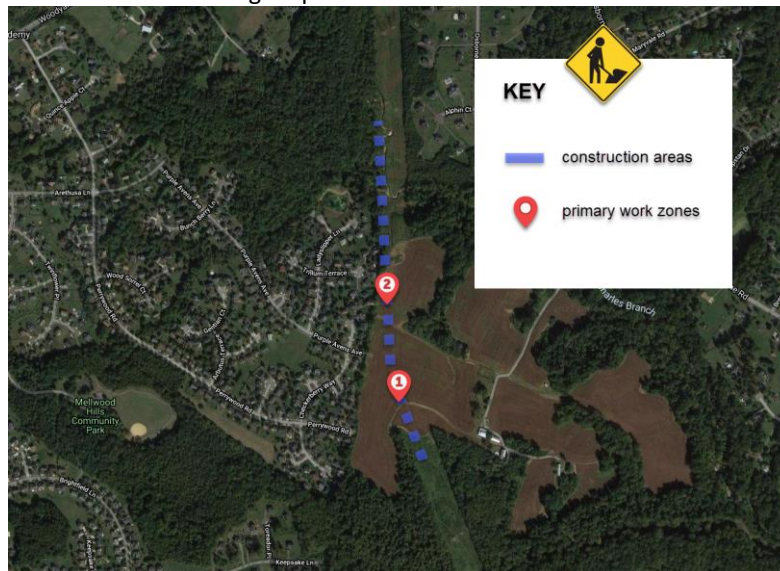

Night Work Notice

Construction activities in the electric utility corridor near the Melwood Springs Community, may occur during off-peak daytime hours and overnight during pipe pullback operations estimated to take 2-3 days to complete. Continuous operations for pipe pullback are necessary to prevent delays and complications that typically arise when this operation is not performed continuously. Two periods of continuous work for pipe pullback are anticipated, one for each of the primary work zones as shown on the following map:



Primary work zone #1: Expected to begin as early as Tuesday October 26, 2021

Primary work zone #2: Expected to begin as early as Monday November 8, 2021

Construction schedules may be affected by weather and other unforeseen circumstances and is dependent on the date of temporary noise waiver approval. Given the night-work schedule uncertainty, we'll provide notice to the community HOA via email 1-2 days prior to the start of each continuous work period.

The temporary noise waiver will be permitted by the Prince George's County Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement. With the focus of minimizing disturbance to your community, sound reduction walls have been installed around the primary work sites to reduce the noise disruption for the community.

What Can I Expect During Night Work?

You can expect to see Washington Gas and contractor vehicles and equipment, the work area well illuminated, and you may feel and hear construction activity. As a reminder, for your safety and the safety of construction personnel, do not cross construction barriers, enter construction areas, or approach vehicles or equipment.
